Shane is a certified American Sign Language Interpreter with more 10 years experience. His current specializations include medical and mental health interpretation. He currently serves as a staff interpreter at a network of hospitals in the metro Washington, DC area. Prior to his career in ASL Interpretation, Shane worked as a Sexual Assault Victims Advocate for the State Attorney's Office of Florida. He later earned a Master's in Clinical Psychology, and is currently a doctoral candidate in the field of Clinic Psychology, with an emphasis in neuropsychology. His research interests include the therapeutic alliances that form when working with an interpreter as well as the prevalence of compassion fatigue among interpreters.

Shane was trained at Neuropsychology Associates of Fairfax to administer multiple psychological batteries and incorporate and integrate information from clinical interviews, and behavioral observations for individuals with suspected neuropsychological impairments. He is currently a psychology extern at the River School of Washington, DC, a leader in clinical research and training in the area of child language and literacy as it related to hearing loss and aural rehabilitation.
